## National seminar concludes

**RONO HILLS, Mar 19:** Don't look for jobs, look for a career because getting a degree is not enough, you should be employed, NIT director Prof Pinakeswar Mahanta told research scholars here Tuesday. Addressing the valedictory function of the two-day national seminar on "India/NE India: Issues, dynamics & emerging realities" at RGU here, Prof Mahanta said, "Do research on Arunachal's biodiversity and utilize the flora and fauna resourcefully so that you can start-up on your own. Local scenes are very important. The different kinds of bamboo found in this region are one such example where you can find the opportunity to kick-start your career." HoD Political Science Prof PK Panigrahi, in his speech, focused on issues and challenges faced by the researchers. Give your research proper shape by making your work worthy of study, he said.

He also advised the scholars on the originality of research work. Anti-academic writing style like plagiarism should be avoided. It is unethical and at the same time breaches the institution's integrity, Prof Panigrahi added. RGURSF chairman Margum Ado extended gratitude to the department of Investment and Planning, governor, Rajiv Gandhi University, Himalayan University and Vijaya Bank for their support. RGURSF general secretary Kosen Jida, seminar coordinator Prof Jumyir Basar, faculty convenor assistant professor Lisa Lomdak was also present.
