RONO HILLS, Mar 19: NIT director Professor Pinakeswar Mahanta while addressing the valedictory function of the two-day national seminar on "India/NE India: Issues, dynamics & emerging realities" at RGU today appealed the scholars to think beyond the narrow mind-set of garnering a job only. "Don't look for jobs, look for a career because getting a degree is not enough," urged the NIT director. "Do research on Arunachal's biodiversity and utilize the flora and fauna resourcefully so that you can start-up on your own. Local scenes are very important. The different kinds of bamboo found in this region are one such example where you can find the opportunity to kick-start your career," Mahanta emphasized. HoD of Political Science Professor PK Panigrahi, advised the researchers to give proper shape to their research by making them worthy of study. He also stressed on the originality of research work, by shunning plagiarism which is unethical and degrades the institution's integrity.
