Curtains on RGU's plastic-free campaign

RONO HILLS, Oct 22: The department of Social Work, Rajiv Gandhi University, successfully concluded its 'Plastic Free Campaign' which started on September 4 till October 22 as part of the Swachhata Hi Seva programme.
