RGURSF condemns police brutality

RONO HILLS, Dec 17: Rajiv Gandhi University Research Scholars' Forum (RGURSF) on Tuesday condemned the alleged police brutality on students of Jamia Millia Islamia University and at Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) who were peacefully protesting against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act which turned violent. "We condemn in strongest terms all acts of violence, abuse of power, excessive use of force and assault on our constitutional rights," the RGURSF said in a statement here. Extending solidarity with Jamia and AMU students, the RGURSF general secretary Prem Taba said, "The visuals of police excesses shared on social media are a grim manifesto that civil rights no longer exist and that students are no longer safe in universities. They will enter our hostel rooms and libraries to prove that we are no longer a democracy." "We demand that the arrested students be released unconditionally, police violence curbed in Jamia and AMU immediately with their complete exit from university premises followed by an SIT probe into the blatant abuse of power by the police at the university premises," Taba said. The RGURSF said that the RGU students are also protesting against the CAA which they fear will have severe demographic imbalance in the entire Northeastern region. "Misso Nobin, an MA Sociology student of the university, has begun an indefinite strike against the CAA since December 15," Taba informed.
